Hundertwasser's paintings



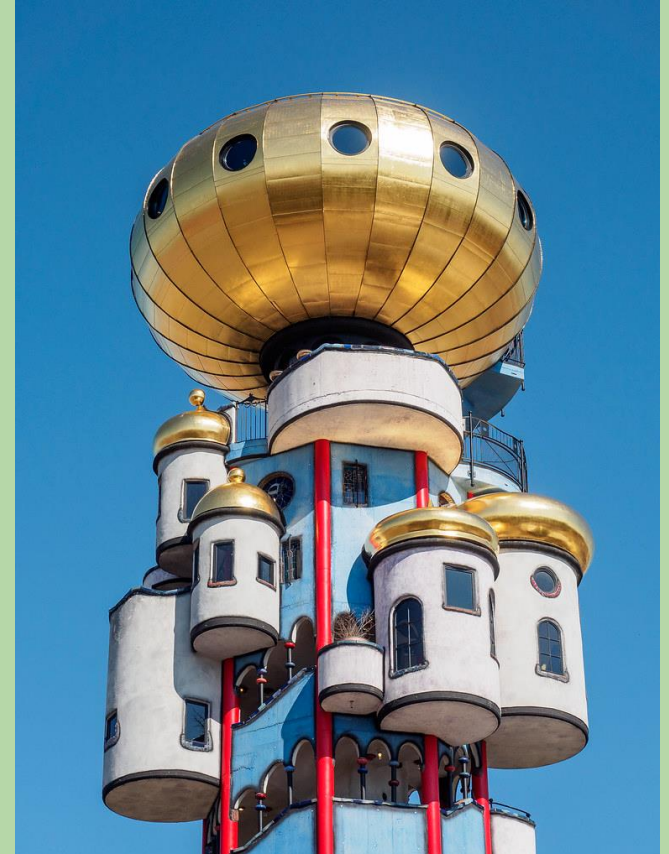
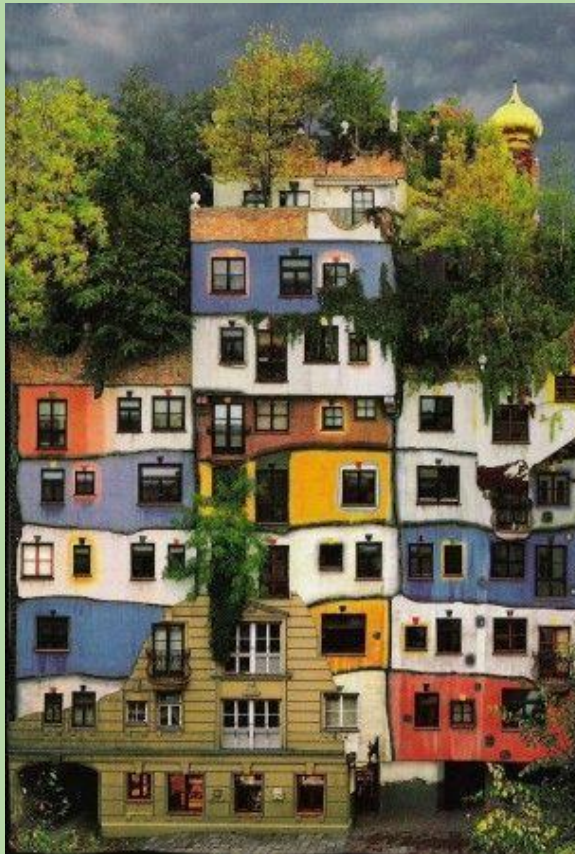
Hundertwasser's paintings come from his imagination rather than from something he had seen in real life. He loved using organic wavy lines in his work, as he was very inspired by nature. He didn't like using straight lines in his paintings, and was fascinated by spirals, as he noticed there were few straight lines in nature. Hundertwasser always used wonderful bright colours in his paintings.

The two paintings above show how Hundertwasser often incorporated buildings into his work - although they are not buildings as we know them!

Hundertwasser's buildings

Hundertwasser's amazing, unusual buildings can be found in Austria and Germany. He hated the way that most buildings had straight lines and angles. His building designs used natural forms, and often fit around nature.

Often he included grass roofs, uneven floors, turrets and even trees growing out of windows!
