Aims and Outcomes: This project invites you to do a presentation about yourself, in Spanish, including aspects such as school, commute, friends and family and thinking about your future.

In this leaflet about yourself you will show how unique and special you are.

- During the next five weeks you will:
- Understand information and follow instructions.
- Write sentences in Spanish on a range of topics using a model, presenting simple daily routines and use the vocabulary learnt since year 3 to talk/write about school, transports, family and friends, likes and dislikes, and hobbies/ sports.
- Create a presentation all in Spanish, using a dictionary or glossary to find interesting new words.
- Use pronunciation and intonation effectively to accurately express meaning and engage an audience.
- Understand the gist of spoken passages containing complex sentences.

I can understand the gist of spoken passage containing complex sentences.

Today you will listen to your friends reading their presentation.

1- Listen carefully and try to understand what they are saying. To do this you will need to use the different skills used to understand and decode a foreign language:

Listen for known words.

Listen for cognates.

Look at the illustrations.

Use the bilingual dictionary or translating online tool.

You should be able to understand the gist of spoken passages with complex sentences; descriptions, information given.

2- Re-tell or discuss the main points of what you have heard. You should be able to tell your friends what you heard and understood.

For this use: tiene: has, es: is and le gusta: he/she likes.

3- Try to agree and disagree with some of the statements. Maybe your friend likes something that you do not. You could say: no estoy de acuerdo: I do not agree, A mi no me gusta: I do not like.
