History

In this unit children will be building on the Genesis story and Christian, Jewish and Muslim (Abrahamic) belief that God/Allah made the world. Children will explore in more detail the belief in the creation of humankind. They will be investigating 'what makes us human,' from Hindu and Buddhist perspectives as well as Abrahamic beliefs about the soul.

Computing **Spreadsheets**

Children will be using the Purple Mash to develop their knowledge of spreadsheets and how they can be used effectively. By the end of the unit they will be able to use data to manually create a block graph.

This term, children will make comparisons between living and non-living things. Children will notice that living things have offspring which resemble their parents and that they themselves grow into adults which reproduce. In addition, they will order the stages of growth of humans

from birth to old age and complete a Quest by imagining they are curators of a museum where they will curate an exhibition on living things. They will also design an information board for an exhibit comparing living, not living and never living things.
