Literacy



As Readers, we will be:

- Developing knowledge of letter sounds
- Hearing and saying sounds in words, for example the sounds in bat are: b – a – t
- Segmenting sounds in short words and blending, for example c-a-t...cat.
- Recognising high frequency words
- Talking about the stories we have read

As Writers, we will be:

- Continue to practise writing our names
- Practising writing CVC words, - e.g. man
- Write simple sentences using sound knowledge.
