

Assessment in EYFS

Progress against the outcomes of the EYFS Profile is monitored through

- daily observations of child initiated activities
- participation in adult focus tasks
- discussion of children between staff members and with parents.

Observations are recorded in an online learning journal called Tapestry (www.eylj.org). Parents will be given login details to access and view photographs and videos of their child's learning.

Parents are also able to upload observations of learning taking place at home, as well as like and comment on existing observations.

We also have WOW books where children's work is celebrated and shared.

Home Learning

Parental contributions form a crucial part of your child's learning journey and observations from home can be added to Tapestry.

We encourage you to share your child's learning, achievements and experiences with us in order to build a more complete picture of your child.

Your child will be issued with a reading book from school. Please read daily at home.

Additional homework activities will be issued weekly in the Autumn term.





Food and Drink

- Lunchtime is between 12.00 and 13.00. Children can have a packed lunch from home or a school dinner.
- Halal and vegetarian options are always available.
- Packed lunches should support our school's healthy eating policy. All types of nuts are banned. Fizzy drinks, sweets and chocolate should not be included in school lunches.
- Please let us know of dietary restrictions and allergies.
- Fruit, milk and water are available throughout the day.

School Uniform

- ▶ All Reception children wear the Leopold school uniform.
- School jumper or cardigan
- White shirt or blouse
- Black trousers or skirt/ summer dress
- Black school shoes
- · School tie
- Jewellery, nail varnish, colourful trainers and sandals are not permitted.
- Children also require a school book bag which should be brought to school everyday.
- For PE lessons your child will need:
- White t-shirt
- Purple jogging bottoms or black shorts
- Black plimsolls or trainers



Please ensure that all clothing and belongings are clearly labelled.

Starting School

You will receive a letter confirming your child's start date.

During September you will have a staggered start.

1st week- 8.30 - 11.30

2nd week 8.30 - 1.30

3rd week 8.30 - 3.30

The staggered start allows children to gain confidence in the setting and settle into their new classes. Children should wear full school uniform from on their first day and should also bring their PE kit, book Bag and water bottle.

Please schedule a home visit.



Attendance and Illness

 School gates open at 8.30 and lessons start at 8.45. Please ensure your child is on time for school and collected promptly at 3.30.

Inform the school if someone other than you will be collecting your child.

If your child is unwell, please telephone the school office to let them know that your child will be unable to attend.

 Ensure that the school has all relevant and up to date contact details.

Preparing Your Child

- Home visits and transition days
- Talk about starting school and what to expect
- Encourage independence: using the toilet, washing their hands, putting on their coat
- Teach your child to be responsible: looking after belongings, tidying up, helping at home
- Have lots of outdoor play and point out letters and shapes in the environment
- Play games that require turn taking and sharing
- Singing songs and learning nursery rhymes


