Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to school! We have had an exciting first week back! We are looking forward to a very active Spring 2 with lots of great learning opportunities.

As we are now open to all children we ask that only one parent/guardian comes to school with their child.

Social distancing is supported by markings on the pavement at the front of the school building. Remember to form an orderly line outside of the school. Please arrive at school on time and avoid arriving early so that groups do not form on the pavement outside of the school. We encourage all parents to wear face masks when dropping and collecting children from school. Drop off and collection needs to be a swift process to enable social distancing and allow children to get to class swiftly.

Please be respectful and patient, as the school endeavours to keep everyone safe during this pandemic.

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Unfortunately, we have had 2 confirmed cases of COVID 19 in Reception and Year 4 at Leopold Gwenneth Rickus. After seeking advise from Public Health England, **reception** and **Year 4** pupils and staff will have to self-isolate for 10 days from the last contact and return to school on **Friday 19th March 2021.** For more information, please visit www.leopoldprimary.co.uk

To keep the school community safe; it is critical that families adhere to the follow guidance.

Under **no** circumstance should you send your child to school:

- If your child is symptomatic
- If someone in your household is symptomatic
- If you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19

Remember that if **you, your child or anyone in your household** have symptoms of COVID-19 and are awaiting the results of a test, **do not** send your children into school. Children must remain at home until the results of the test have been given.

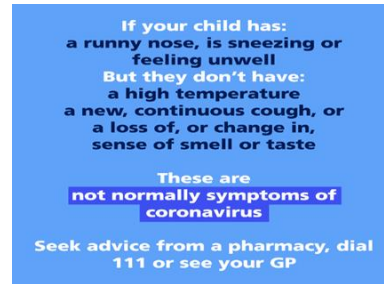
Before making the journey into school, you must stop and ask yourself these questions, do **you, your child or anyone in your household** have a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

If you answer YES to any of the above, you must not come to school. You must call 111 for advice.

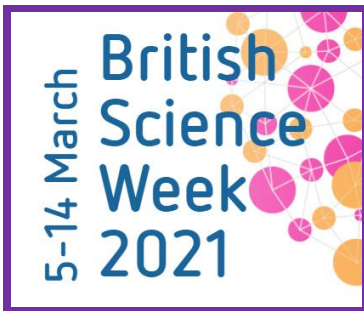
If you child becomes unwell during the school day they will be sent home and are advised to follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.

This sets out that they must:

- self-isolate for at least 10 days
- arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)



Science Week

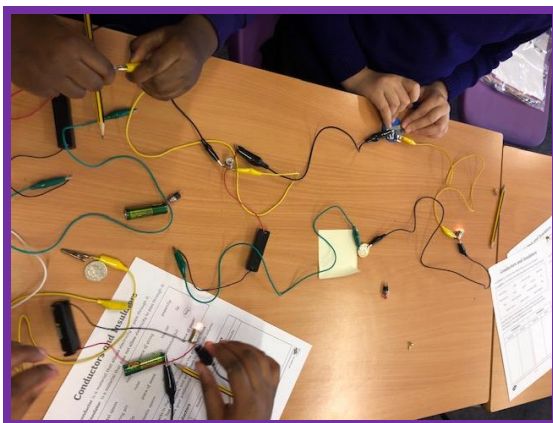

The rest of Science week was used to complete practical experiments! Take a look at some of experiments below.

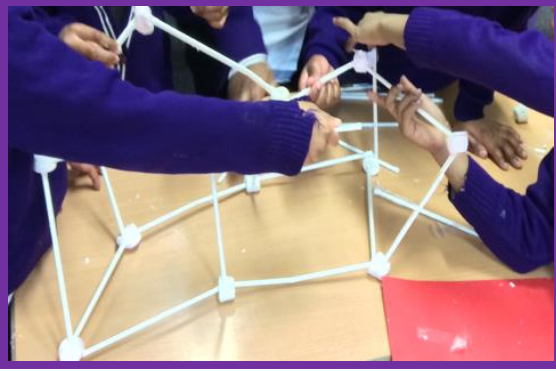



Parent Gym



Parent Gym supports parents to give their children the best start in life through their **free, six-week** parenting programme. The programme helps parents to develop their practical parenting skills and provide a nurturing family environment. This in turn enables **children to make the most of all the learning opportunities that you provide at school.**

Their work is delivered at no cost to state-funded schools and children's centres. As a result of lockdown, they have developed a **virtual version** of their six-week programme. They are really pleased **to offer this to as many families as possible** during the summer term.

Here's what's covered in the fun, interactive programme:

- Week One – **CHAT** – How to communicate and listen
- Week Two – **LOVE** – How to balance warmth and discipline
- Week Three – **BEHAVE** – How to be consistent in setting boundaries
- Week Four – **CARE** – How to raise physically and emotionally healthy children
- Week Five – **DISCOVER** – How to encourage a positive learning environment at home
- Week Six – **TOGETHER** – How to build a solid family support network

Parents get a free digital Parent Gym magazine, which covers weekly topics to use during the session and at home. This is a resource full of tips and strategies that parents can refer to at any time after the programme has finished.



The programme can also help develop a sense of community and support by further strengthening connections and creating friendships amongst parents – this can be within a specific year group or across the whole primary school, whichever you prefer. Parents often continue their journey together after the programme has ended.
