Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the last two weeks pupils have settled back into school well. Our in-house therapist has delivered well-being and mindfulness workshops to ease the children back into the school routine. Remember, it is compulsory for the pupils to attend school, remote learning will not be taking place (unless a bubble is isolating); however, the pupils will be able to continue using the online platforms to complete homework.

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

To keep the school community safe; it is critical that families adhere to the follow guidance.

Under **no** circumstance should you send your child to school:

- If your child is symptomatic
- If someone in your household is symptomatic
- If you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19

Remember that if **you, your child or anyone in your household** have symptoms of COVID-19 and are awaiting the results of a test, **do not** send your children into school. Children must remain at home until the results of the test have been given.

Before making the journey into school, you must stop and ask yourself these questions, do **you, your child or anyone in your household** have a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

If you answer YES to any of the above, you must not come to school. You must call 111 for advice.

If your child becomes unwell during the school day they will be sent home and are advised to follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.

This sets out that they must:

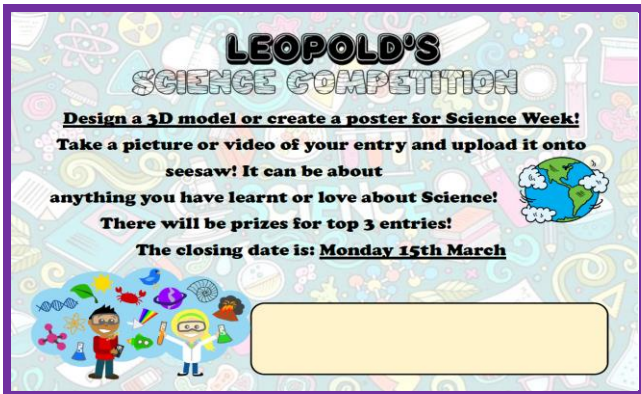
- self-isolate for at least 10 days
- arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)

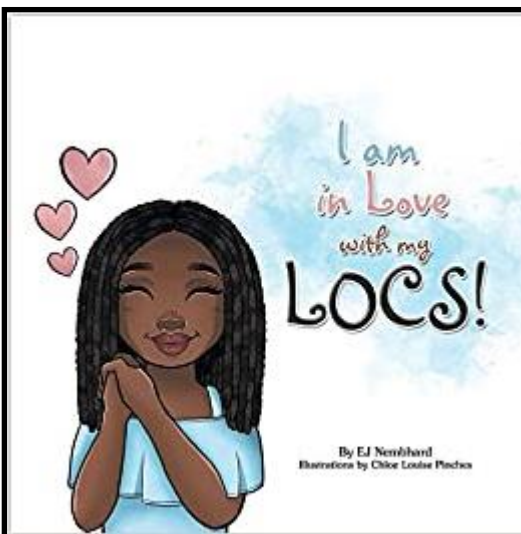

Music

It has been great to see lots of children at Leopold enjoying instrumental lessons with our visiting music tutors from Brent Music Service. We still have some spaces available for lessons in the summer term. Please contact the office as soon as possible if you would like to sign your child up for any of the following instruments and a payment will be set up for you on ParentPay.



30-minute lessons (in groups of up to 4): £55 per term

- Keyboard
- Violin
- Guitar

Piano 20-minute lessons in pairs: £75 per term

Piano 20-minute lessons 1-1: £150 per term

A reduction of £45 in tuition fees (per term, per pupil) is available from BMS for children currently receiving Free School Meals. On receiving this, children must show good attendance and good progress.

Lessons will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis and some children may be placed on a waiting list if spaces fill up.

Parent Gym



Parent Gym supports parents to give their children the best start in life through their **free, six-week** parenting programme. The programme helps parents to develop their practical parenting skills and provide a nurturing family environment. This in turn enables **children to make the most of all the learning opportunities that you provide at school.**

Their work is delivered at no cost to state-funded schools and children's centres. As a result of lockdown, they have developed a **virtual version** of their six-week programme, which they are really pleased **to offer to as many families as possible** during the summer term.

Here's what's covered in the fun, interactive programme:

- Week One – **CHAT** – How to communicate and listen
- Week Two – **LOVE** – How to balance warmth and discipline
- Week Three – **BEHAVE** – How to be consistent in setting boundaries
- Week Four – **CARE** – How to raise physically and emotionally healthy children
- Week Five – **DISCOVER** – How to encourage a positive learning environment at home
- Week Six – **TOGETHER** – How to build a solid family support network

Parents get free the digital Parent Gym magazine covering the weekly topic to use during the session and at home. This is a resource full of tips and strategies that parents can refer to at any time after the programme has finished.

The programme can also help develop a sense of community and support by further strengthening connections and creating friendships amongst parents – this can be within a specific year group or



across the whole primary school, whichever you prefer. Parents often continue their journey together after the programme has ended.

Concerns for safety



There have been two incidents in the local area, where an unidentified male has approached schoolgirls walking home on their own. The two incidents are being considered as linked.

See pupils/parents general safety advice when travelling to and from school.

- Travel in groups where possible and stick to busy roads.
- Ensure that the pupils walking home alone keep charged mobile phones with them and inform family/friends when leaving school so that they will have an idea of when to expect them when they get home.
- Do not engage with strangers who approach them. They should run away and call 999 immediately if they fear for their safety.
- Police should be contacted as soon as possible and the school should be informed so that the circumstances can be investigated at the earliest opportunity.



- If any direct contact is made with clothing then keep this as there may be forensic opportunities for the police to progress.
