Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week the school celebrated Red Nose Day and it was lovely to see many children dressed up in red. Thank you to all the children who contributed £1, which will go towards a good cause- Comic Relief.

Since returning from lockdown, the majority of pupils have settled in well after spending a great deal of time at home. Thank you once again for supporting your child through this transition period. I would like to remind all parents that attendance onsite is compulsory. For the first week back, the overall attendance of pupils was only 97.07%, which is higher than the national percentage of 96%. This is an excellent achievement!

Remember it is imperative that all children attend school every day so that they do not miss out on any further learning. Of course, if your child is unwell, please follow the school procedures when reporting sickness.

Attendance

As per government guidelines, school attendance is mandatory. To achieve this please ensure that your child attends live sessions or the provision daily. Coronavirus (COVID-19)

The government yesterday announced that shielding guidance is being paused. From Thursday 1st April, clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV) people are no longer advised to shield. To keep the school community safe; it is critical that families adhere to the follow guidance.

Under **no** circumstance should you send your child to school:

- If your child is symptomatic
- If someone in your household is symptomatic
- If you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19

Remember that if **you**, **your child or anyone in your household** have symptoms of COVID-19 and are awaiting the results of a test, **do not** send your children into school. Children must remain at home until the results of the test have been given.

Before making the journey into school, you must stop and ask yourself these questions, do **you, your child or anyone in your household** have a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).









If you answer YES to any of the above, you must not come to school. You must call 111 for advice.

If you child becomes unwell during the school day they will be sent home and are advised to follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection. This sets out that they must:

- self-isolate for at least 10 days
- arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)

You are completely free to refuse to provide your consent to any of these things. You do not have to provide reasons for refusing your consent, but we are happy for you to give us additional information if you choose to so that we understand any concerns that you have and can take appropriate steps where necessary.

Photographs and Videos

Some of the information in the attached tables includes photographs and videos of your child. We assure you that we take very seriously the issue of potential misuse of photographs and videos of our pupils, and have the following measures in place:

Leopold Primary School may provide photographs and videos to the media, or may be visited by the media who will take videos and photographs. When these have been submitted to or taken by the media, Leopold Primary School has no control over these.



Safeguarding

SAFEGUARDING IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

Now that schools are open again it helps to go over some rules with your child about staying safe when travelling to and from school alone.

- Remind your child to go straight to school and straight home no stopping to chat with friends playing in the park or visiting shops on the way.
- Ask them about how their journey went talk about any concerns or worries they may have.
- Talk to them about road safety. They should always look both ways before crossing the road, and never be on their phone whilst crossing a road.









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- Explain how important it is to keep alert, keep walking and not to be distracted by other people in the street.
- Remind them not to use their phone whilst walking and to keep their phone safely out of sight.
- Remind them never to engage in conversation or accept a lift from someone they do not know.
- Make sure they know their address and your telephone number by heart, in case they get lost or have to navigate home from somewhere new.
- If they have a mobile phone, remind them to fully charge it before leaving the house, and make sure they have all your contact numbers saved.
- Remind them that if they feel unsafe or uncomfortable at any time, they can call you or a trusted adult.
- If they ever feel like they're in immediate danger, they should call the police straight away on 999.
