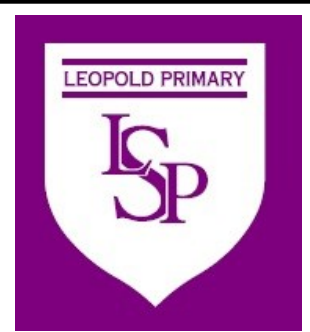

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

Our learning topic this term will be Under the Sea. Please find below exciting activities to complete together with your child at home. It would be great if you could upload pictures and videos of your home learning to Tapestry for us to share in the fun.



MATHS

This term our focus for Maths is going to be recognizing number, counting and matching numeral to quantity. These lessons can also be made practical in a range of ways! Ideas include:

- Counting steps, claps and jumps
- Searching for numbers in jelly, pasta or rice
- Writing numbers on pieces of paper and children have to splat/ scrunch the number you call out
- Creating home made dot to dot number sheets
- Musical maths—singing along to number songs

PE and PSED

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Understanding the World covers many areas of the curriculum such as History, Science, Geography and Religious Education. Some ideas to foster children's curiosity include:

- Making a list of everything your child can see outside of the window, discussing and describing the appearance and function of each object.
- Create a picture of the family using different materials such as paper, pencils, pens, tissue paper or other collage materials such as pipe cleaners and pom poms
- Design a treasure map and go on a treasure hunt around your house or garden. You can make your map look authentic by rubbing a used tea bag over the surface and leaving to dry.
