## ONE SCHOOL, MANY OPTIONS

In the EYFS, children benefit from an organic dual language environment. Primary teachers alternate classes in English and in French. From Y7 to Y11 students may choose the French track or the English International Programme. In Y12 students make the final decision: French Bac or IB Diploma.

## Two languages from age 3

Parents frequently ask when is the best time to start a second language. Our answer is “as soon as possible”!

Research shows that foreign language skills develop better and take deeper roots in early childhood at the language acquisition stage, precisely when the brain's plasticity and efficiency are naturally and entirely focused on this major human achievement.

With 16 students and two teachers simultaneously using their own native tongue, our Early Year classroom feels like our typical international family, the ideal setting for our little ones to transition from home to school.



Allowing the young brain to accept both languages at the same time creates the ideal conditions of a challenging, yet perfectly safe, learning environment, where the mastery of both cultures comes as naturally as if the children were growing up in a bicultural home.

We believe that the first school years constitute a critical right of passage, as they lay the foundations for future knowledge. It is therefore paramount that it be a happy, positive, confidence-building and exciting experience. One of our main goals is to plant in everyone the life-long seeds of resilience, curiosity and the joy of learning.





## An inspiring campus

The beautiful 5-acre campus of Lycée International de Londres Winston Churchill is conveniently located near Wembley Park, a residential area a short tube ride away from central London. The school gives a new life to a stunning Art Deco Grade-II listed building. Entirely and purposely renovated, it provides inviting learning spaces filled with light: modern science and technology labs, art studios, a massive gym and a beautiful

canteen overlooking the gardens where the students and staff gather and enjoy a community moment over a home-cooked lunch. Outside three MUGAs and two Primary dedicated playgrounds complete our sports and recreation facilities.






## OUR SIGNATURE CLASSES FOSTER CURIOSITY

These unique programmes rely exclusively on our teachers' formidable expertise and creativity beyond the traditional curriculum. Teachers pick challenging topics and lead over a few weeks a small team of students through vigorous intellectual pursuits .

## “REMOTE LIL”: LEARNING FROM HOME

Under the guidance of the Director of Academic Research and Innovation, our teachers have created a unique online platform to continue to teach the Lower Secondary classes and keep students actively learning while our Senior students

sit the official exams at school. This is an opportunity to experiment with a variety of teaching and learning approaches. This signature programme was shortlisted for the ISA Awards 2020.

### AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMME

Over 30 activities are on offer every week at the end of the school day until 17h for Primary students and 17h30 in Secondary school. Child supervision (Garderie) is also available to Primary families until 18h.

### SPORTS AND FITNESS

Sports and Physical Education are integral parts of the curriculum and the school life. PE classes and ASP activities include rugby, handball, hockey, basketball, football, boxing, yoga, badminton, laser run, fencing, modern dance, swimming. These help develop the young body, instill healthy exercise habits in our children, and allow them to discover their athletic abilities or talents. Competitions and friendlies are organised with local schools.


## UNI PREP WEEK: GETTING THE PROCEDURE RIGHT
