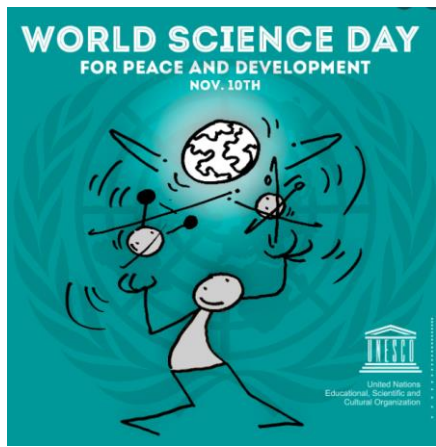


Science is practical... Science is fun!

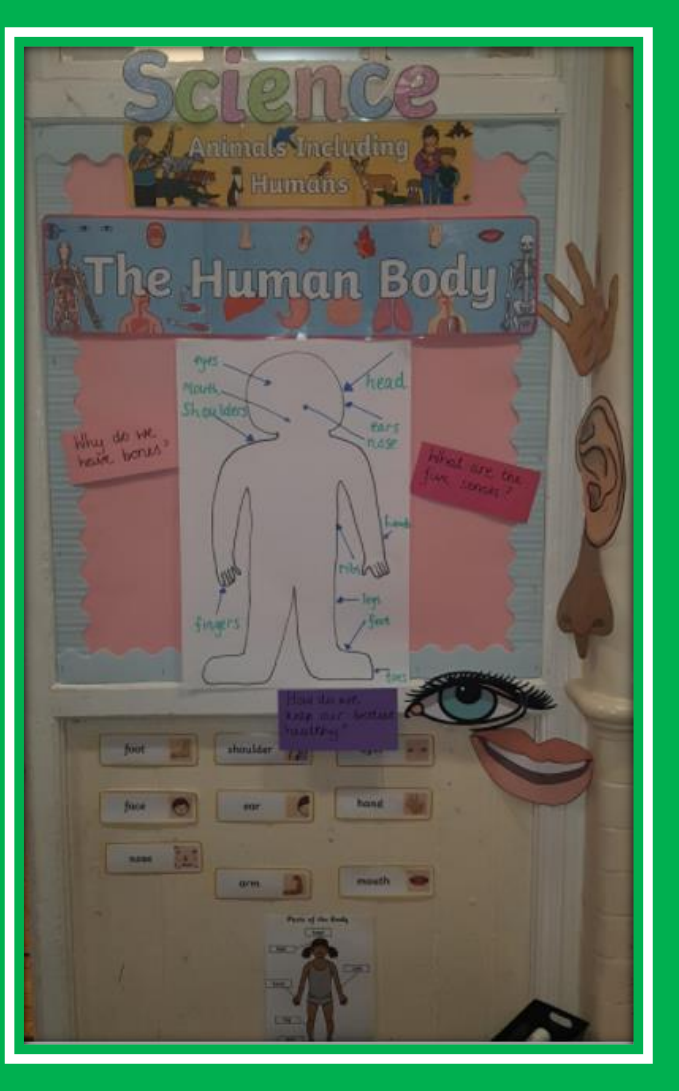
