MATHEMATICS

We are learning to understand place value, counting to 100 and number bonds.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

MUSIC

Writing

We will be writing for different purposes such as: stories, recounts, diary entries and newspaper reports.

Art: We will learn about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers.

SCIENCE

Areas of focus - Habitats

We will be looking at different habitats and what makes them suitable for certain animals and plants. We will look at the basic needs of animals, including humans, and see what is needed for survival and where they can be found.



PSHE

HOW PARENTS CAN HELP:

Due to this year's circumstances, it is vital that we keep children safe in their return to school. Please ensure your child arrives to school on time every day as well as collected promptly at the end of the day. A book and a reading record will be issued to your child so they can read every day at home; ideally with an adult who can ask them questions as about what they have read. Please make sure reading records are used in conjunction with reading. Year 2 children should also be practising their 2,5, and 10times tables on Purple mash every day. When it is issued, ensure all homework is completed to a high standard and handed in on time. There will be instances when we will be using our online platform (Seesaw) throughout the term as we adjust back to daily school life so please make sure work is completed. Finally, you can get in touch with your class teacher through the class dojo app from September.

Tips for home:

Ensure your child arrives to school on time with everything s/he needs.

Read with your child every day. Practice weekly spellings with your child. Practice times-tables or other number facts with your child. Ensure your child has a quiet table to sit at and time allocated to do some of his/her home learning. Have your child write about what they did at school in a journal each day to improve their writing skills.
